Minutes of the Meeting of September 8, 2010 (draft)

The meeting started at 7:05 p.m.

Commission Members Present: Bob Pulver (Chair), Fred Stocking (Secretary), Carol Korty, Amy Morley, David Schick, Annie Crisafulli (alternate) and Nancy Pochan (alternate);

Others present: Kathy Gaianguest, Craig Milner

1. Review of minutes of the May Meeting: Minutes of the June Meeting were read and approved 5 in favor and 0 opposed.

2. Planning Board and Selectman Concerns: None presented.

3. Shore Clean-up: Amy just returned from a boat trip with David Herrick, Lamoine's Harbormaster. Amy's understanding is that the State will provide both posters and an online registration program, as well as trash bags and data sheets which will be sent to Amy, and gloves that will be available at the sign-up. David Herrick will use his skiff to gather trash. The State Park truck will transport the trash to the transfer station.

Bob added that Jim Norris had indicated that local clammers would not be participating much during the 9-12 period on the 4th, because that's a working tide for them. Jim indicated that if we give them a map identifying trash below high tide, they will haul it out later.

The LCC's primary chore is recruiting, via posters, the school newsletter and personal contacts. We should also do some landowner contacts around access points for trucks to do pick-up. Trash can be stashed at these access points until pick-up. Craig noted that some of the territory between the Park and Lamoine beach is slippery and that there is poison ivy in the upland. He also suggested a bag for trash and one for recyclables—and adding that to the publicity after the event to stress the importance of recycling.

Fred will talk to Cathleen Rybarz/Bruce Gillett about access for the truck down Ice House Lane. Bob will talk to Jay at the Park about contacting landowners along the route. Bob will call a work session for Friday September 17th at 4 pm if needed to get organized on this chore.

We should get something in the Lamoine Quarterly on the Shore Clean-up.

4. Lamoine Quarterly: Deadline will be somewhere around September 20-25th. Fred will do something on the Wind Power talk in July and the October Weatherization Program. Amy will do something on Shore Clean-Up. Carol will do something on Eelgrass restoration. Nancy or Annie will do something on the August Star-gaze.

5. Weatherization Program: Kathie Gaianguest presented a proposal on behalf of the Lamoine Fuel Buyers Group. That group wants to branch out from buying fuel to reducing the need for fuel. With Winter coming on, she would like to put together a program for the October LCC meeting. Someone will talk about how to access energy audits, there might be a demonstration of how to make indoor insulation panels for windows or other do-it-yourself forms of weatherization. Bob suggested that Kathie call the State Extension folks, David suggested the Washington –Hancock Community Action Program, which has a very active weatherization program. The LCC kicked around the idea of inviting

the public to call-in with other suggestions, with one LCC member answering the phone and transmitting the tip to those in attendance and watching on television. Kathie will get PR material on this to Fred by September 23rd, and Fred will distribute it to the Lamoine Quarterly, Stu's Town events e-mail list and the Conservation Commission e-mail list.

The meeting adjourned at 8:20.
